Prom Information for Juniors, Seniors and Parents!!!

- 1. Juniors – Gym decorating will be Tuesday, April 24 – Thursday, April 26 from 5:00 – 9:00 pm. We need a minimum of 15 Juniors each night to open the gym. We will need a large group of boys to help with wiring the ceiling on Tuesday, April 24. Please sign up to decorate on the sheet on the prom board outside of Mrs. Thorson’s door.**
- 2. Again this year all Grand March Participants must pay \$5.00 per person when they sign up for Grand March. You will not be able to sign up for a slot without full payment! Students can sign up and pay with Diana Ouverson by Monday, April 23rd!**
- 3. LHS Junior and Senior prom goers will be given 2 preferred seating tickets for the Grand March for their family. Students must pick up tickets in the high school office during prom week. Preferred seating tickets WILL NOT be available prom night.**
- 4. General admission tickets will be available ahead of time in the high school office during prom week, or at the door on prom night for \$3.**
- 5. The day of prom, the gym will be open from 4:30 – 6:00 pm for parents and couples wishing to take photographs in the gym. Photographs WILL NOT be allowed in the hallways nor the gym after the grand march as this creates a fire hazard. When the Grand March has finished observers MUST exit through their designated door in order to create a safe environment and allow the dance to start. If you would like to take pictures with your child you must meet them under the front entrance canopy. Parents that would like to assist with exiting procedures and have a reserved front row seat should contact Caroline Thorson in the high school or email c.thorson@isd2184.net.**
- 6. Doors will open for Grand March at:**
 - 7:15 pm for Preferred Seating** this will include the bottom 27 rows of bleachers and first choice for seating in the theatre.
 - 7:30 pm for General Admission Seating** this will include the remaining rows of bleachers and seats in the theatre. When you arrive please wait in your designated line.
- 7. The Grand March will begin at 8:00 pm.** Couples will go through the Grand March one time. You will first walk through the gym and then through the theatre. After having your car valet parked you will check in at the front entrance and receive two notecards with your grand march number. You will then proceed to the small gym for further directions. Students will not be allowed to chew gum while going through the Grand March.

7. Myhre Studio will be taking pictures in the gym starting at 3:30 pm. A signup sheet for photo times and order forms will be available in the high school office two weeks before Prom. Bring completed order form and payment prom night.

8. The grand march will be recorded and played at a later time on Luverne's Local Access Cable Channel.

9. Parking for couples attending prom will be Valet only. **Students must have their car parked by the valet attendants or turn over their keys.** Keys will be kept in a safe place until the dance is over. Students who attend the Grand March will be required to stay for the dance. Keys may be picked up at 11:30 pm. Any parents that plan on switching vehicles with their student should exchange the keys with Amy Cook, preferably before the Grand March. She will be stationed in the entryway of the main doors. 10. DRESS CODE

Prom can be a wonderful time of picking out elegant dresses and dapper tuxedos. There are lots to choose from and especially in the area of dresses, there are many different types. As a school, it is **our expectation** that students, along with their parents, pick out attire that is appropriate for a public school function such as prom.

With all the variations of attire out there, it is extremely hard to provide specific guidelines for dress code. The rule to follow is to limit the exposure of excessive bare skin. For instance, too much showing around the chest, midsection or lower back.

While some outfits can be colorful and fun, others can be tasteless, and gaudy. The outfit should be coordinated with no extra props (unless prior approval by the principal has occurred).

Ultimately the prom committee along with the principal reserve the right to prohibit a person from participating in the Grand March/Prom, if his or her attire is deemed inappropriate for the event. If you question whether or not an outfit is appropriate, please get prior approval with the aforementioned.

Prom is an exciting night, and as a school we desire for it to be classy, while upholding our high standards for behavior, including how one represents him or herself in the manner of dress. If you have questions, please feel free to contact the school.

11. OUT OF TOWN GUESTS
